With so much going on in the world that could be discouraging, it is quite encouraging whenever one sees acts of heroism, leadership, and faith. This coming Wednesday we will see all three as students across the county and in other parts of the globe meet at 7am at the flagpole in front of their school to pray.

What first began among a handful of students in 1990 has grown to be an international movement. A group of teens were praying together on a Saturday when God put a powerful burden on their hearts for their friends. They went to three local high schools to pray for their fellow students, and without any specific plan, found themselves at the flagpole. Their experience brought forth a vision that would be shared with many others. Later that year, the first official "See You at the Pole" prayer event was held on campus.

Word spread of what happened like wildfire and the purpose captured the attention and the hearts of many across their home state and in various parts of the country. By the following year, held on Sept 11, 1991, an estimated one million students participated.

Because this prayer movement among young people is student led, not during school hours, and doesn't cost the school district any money, it meets all the legal requirements and concerns that some might hold. More importantly, since the purpose is to pray for their fellow students, teachers, leaders, and community, it is a conduit of peace and unity both on and off campus. More than merely the good intentions of well meaning students, most involved are quick to remind that the idea originated in the heart of God.

This week our beautiful community will join thousands across

America with Jr. High & High School students getting up early and gathering at the flagpoles of their schools to pray. I am convinced that any student willing to do this is the kind that will be making a difference with his or her life. I hope some of them will pray for me.
